#### Route 66 Road Fest Car Club Information Sheet

The American Automobile Association (AAA) will celebrate the exciting history of America's Mother Road - Route 66 - with a series of festivals starting June 2022. The Road Fest in 2022 will start in the middle of Route 66 with weekend shows in both Oklah oma City and Tulsa. After 2022, more cities along the route will be added until the centennial year in 2026 when the shows will have extended from Chicago to Santa Monica.

The Road Fest will offer a dazzling display of varied interests to attract people worldwide. This will include a decade-by-decade journey through time that will start with the roaring 20's (the decade the route opened), an exciting presentation of the Future of Mobility, live music, and many unique and themed activities all related to the automobile and Route 66.

At each event location there will be an outdoor Car Show and will be directly adjacent to the indoor offerings.

#### Car Show Registration Fee:

- The Car Show registration fee is \$20 per car and includes entry to the indoor & outdoor events for the two (2) days.
- One (1) Additional Route 66 Road Fest discounted ticket is available at \$10 per day at time of registration only.
- There will be judging of cars per car class with custom trophies awarded courtesy of AAA, for Top Three of Class.
- All entries will be able to participate in the **Car Show Photo Op that will be in the Car Show parking area**. A backdrop with the Route 66 Road Fest logo will be erected for a free photo opportunity. A festival provided photographer will take a picture of each car and the images will be available for a free download.
- A commemorative dash plaque will be provided to each car entry.
